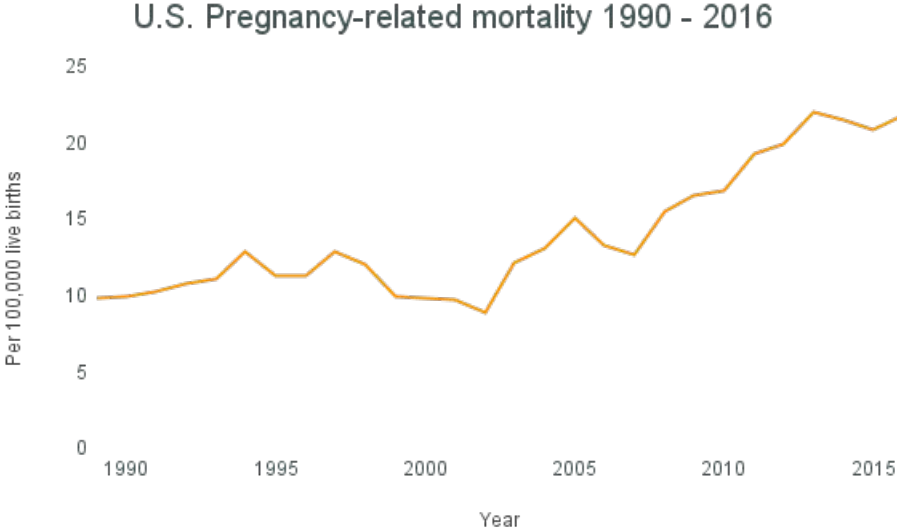

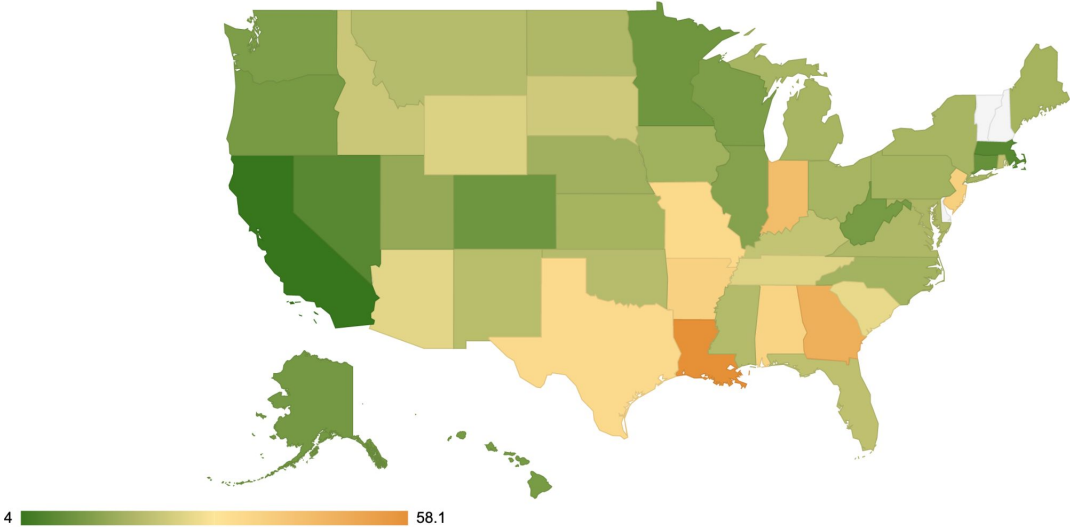

Maternal mortality in the U.S. has increased steadily in the last 10 years.



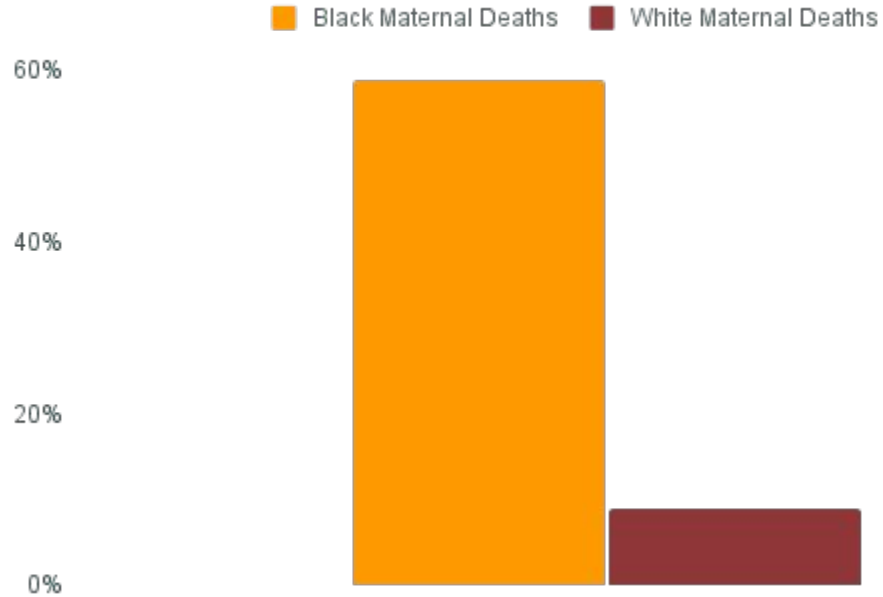

Today, Louisiana has the highest maternal mortality rate: 58 per 100 live births.



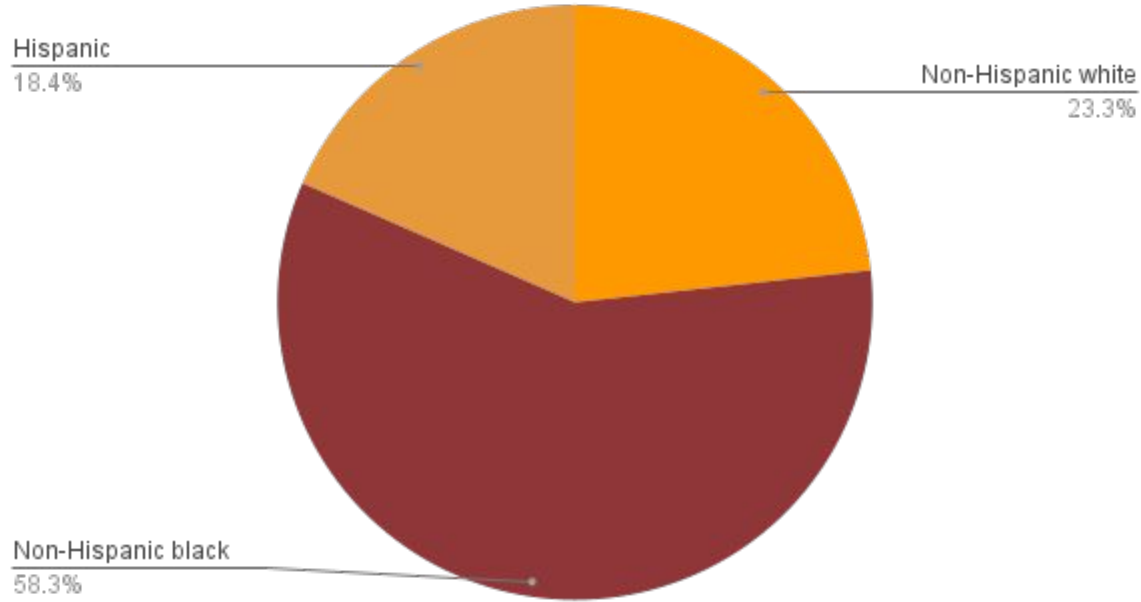

Preventable Maternal Deaths in Louisiana



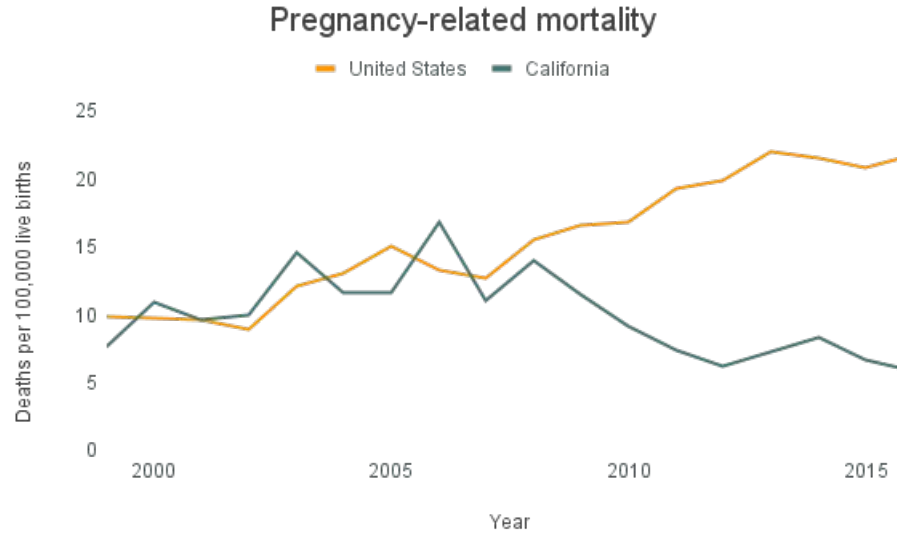

Maternal Mortality by Race and Hispanic Origin

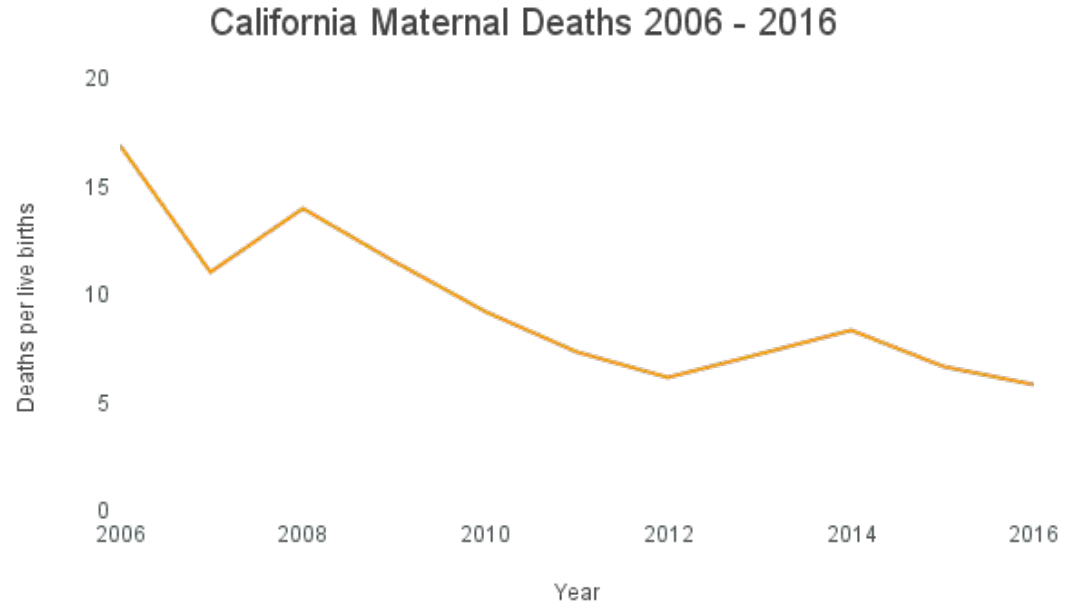
